2010 National Qualifiers



Jamaree Murray will compete in the youth boys 400 and 200 meter dash. Murray currently has the 2nd and 9th best time in the country in the 400m and 200m respectively. He finished 2nd in the 400m and 3rd in the 200m at this year's regional championship and he is a member of the 1600m and 3200m relays which will also be competing at the national championships.



Robert Williams will be competing at his 3rd national championship in the 800 meter run. In 2008, Williams won the national championship in the midget boys (ages 11-12) at 800 meters. Williams is a member of the 1600m and 3200m relays which will also be competing at the national championship.



Kortney Pearce will be making her second appearance at the Junior Olympic meet in the young women's (ages 17-18) shot put and discus. Pearce finished 2nd in regional championship in both the shot put and discus. As a 2010 graduate she will continue throwing at North Carolina State University this fall.



Jaylon Holt a double winner at the NC-USATF State Championship will compete in the intermediate boys (ages 15-16) triple jump and high jump. Holt is ranked 3rd in the high jump and 15th in the triple jump.



Josh McClam was the 2010 NC-USATF State silver medalist and captured the bronze medal on his final attempt at the regional championship. His new personal best of 22 feet 10.50 inches moved him up to #14 on the US National list. He is in perfect position to achieve the All-American honors at the national championship.



David Hamilton is the lead off leg on both the 1600 meter and 3200 meter relay. At the NC-USATF State meet Hamilton ran a personal best 400 meter time of 53.85 and a personal best 800 meter time of 2:14.98. He is a 2009 All-American in the midget boys (ages 11-12) 800 meters.



Noah Winstead will be making his first appearance in national competition as a member of the youth boys (ages 13-14) 3200 meter relay team. Winstead primarily a long distance runner helped the Allstars quartet finish second at the regional championship, establishing a team record of 9 minutes 17.18 seconds.



Theo McKinnon is a new comer to the Allstars and will be making his first appearance to the national championship on the youth boys 1600 meter relay. McKinnon is a 400 meter specialist and helped the relay team finish second at the regional championship, setting a new team record of 3 minutes 44.23 seconds.
